VARP in New York



VARP in New York

Incepted in 2010 under the cooperation with Futura Prague and the Triangle Arts Association in Brooklyn, the VARP in New York program facilitates artist residencies for visual artists from the Visegrad Group (V4) countries in New York City. Applicants will be selected on the basis of their previous work, their potential contribution to the residency stay in New York, as well as the potential benefit they can draw from the program. One artist per V4 country will be selected.

Who can apply?

Visual artists who are citizens of the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, or Slovakia.

Under what conditions can one apply?

1. Applicants must have a very good knowledge of **English** both spoken and written.
2. When applying the applicants must have **finished all other scholarship projects** (scholarships or VARP projects) financed by the Fund; simultaneous applications within any category of the VARP (i.e., applications for residencies taking place in the same year) are **not** permitted. Those who have been already supported within VARP in previous years and have their projects closed are eligible for the support.
3. **Students cannot apply**, i.e., applicants who are enrolled in Bachelor's or Master's programs at any university at the time of applying cannot be considered.
4. Preferred will be those applicants who have not yet received arts scholarship in New York.

What's the length of the residency? When do the projects take place?

- **length: 3 months**—all selected artists take up the residencies **between September**

1 and 30 November 30, 2015

- **deadline for applications: 11:59:59 a.m. (noon) on April 30, 2015**

Where will the residency take place?

The studio is at Triangle Arts Association in **Brooklyn, NY**. Triangle Arts Association is a New York City-based non-profit organization founded in 1982 to support international and U.S. visual artists. Triangle offers studio space and a dynamic artistic community to support the development of projects with emphasis on dialogue and experimentation. Administrative, curatorial, and peer support is provided for all artists-in-residence. Unlike many other residency programs, Triangle does not emphasize specific outcomes but rather allows artists space, context and community within which to focus on ideas, research and process. How much is the support?

€4,000 per project—this sum shall cover the living and travel costs and other costs related to the residency.
